THE HOLY FAMILY which was read at all Masses last weekend is now available on the website.

The parish is now providing a **LIVE STREAMING** service. This enables those not able to attend Mass in person to watch and listen to what is happening during Services in St Joseph's Church. All Sunday Masses, Saturday morning 10am Mass and weekday 9am morning Mass are broadcast. The live stream can be accessed via the parish website.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY sessions are held every Sunday during term time at the 9am Mass. There are five different age groups covering pre-schoolers to teens which all children and young people are invited to join in. We go out after the welcome and return after the bidding prayers. Each group covers the gospel of the day in an age appropriate way. The younger groups take part in a mix of activities – colouring, puzzles, songs, etc to bring the story to life, whilst the older groups are helped to think about the real meaning of the reading and how they can relate it to their lives. We look forward to welcoming everyone when we resume next week after our Christmas break.

RECYCLE OLD CRISP PACKETS FOR

HOMELESS: An artisan in Hastings has come up with an inventive way to help the homeless – creating sleeping bags and liners from old crisp packets. The crisp packets are fused together using an

iron to form a sheet of plastic. It takes 150 empty bags to create one sleeping bag where the foil packets work as insulation. If you would like to support this imaginative project and cut down on landfill, please bundle up your empty, clean crisp packets and bring them to the Parish Office. **TEA IN THE POT** our popular cafe for parents, carers and little ones, re-opens this coming Wednesday 8 January from 8:30am in the Parish Centre.

THE ST JOSEPH'S 200 CLUB 2020 is now open so please do join or renew your current membership for 2020 by 31 January!

Each member is entered into 12 draws held monthly for the next year, with a chance to win one of four prizes each month.
