CANON DAVID OAKLEY APPOINTED BISHOP OF NORTHAMPTON: The Holy Father has appointed Canon David Oakley, a priest of the Archdiocese of Birmingham and currently rector of St Mary's College, Oscott, to be the thirteenth Bishop of Northampton. Cardinal Vincent Nichols will celebrate the Episcopal Ordination of Bishop Elect David in Northampton Cathedral at 11am on the Solemnity of St Joseph 19 March. Bishop Peter Doyle rejoices in this good news. The Bishop has worked closely with Bishop Elect David during his seven years as rector of the seminary at Oscott, and knows him to be a man of faith and prayer, and a pastoral priest and wise teacher. Bishop Peter joins the priests and deacons, and the religious and people of the Diocese of Northampton in giving thanks to God and welcoming Bishop Elect David and praying for him as he prepares for his ordination as Bishop.

The WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY is

traditionally observed from 18 to 25 January - the octave of St Peter and St Paul. The materials for this year's Week of Prayer have been prepared by the Christian churches in Malta and Gozo. On 10 February Christians in Malta celebrate the Feast of the Shipwreck of St Paul, marking and giving thanks for the arrival of Christian faith on the islands. The reading from the Acts of the Apostles used for this feast is the text chosen for this year's Week of Prayer. Hospitality is a much needed virtue in our search for Christian unity. It calls us to a greater generosity to those in need. The people who showed unusual kindness to Paul and his companions did not yet know Christ, and yet it is through their unusual kindness that a divided people were drawn closer together. Our own Christian unity will be discovered not only through showing hospitality to one another, but also through loving encounters with those who do not share our language, culture or faith. In such tempestuous journeys and chance encounters. God's will for his Church and all people comes to fulfilment. As Paul will proclaim in Rome, this salvation of God has been sent to all peoples (see Acts 28:28).

SUNDAY OF THE WORD - 26 JANUARY 2020: "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the Word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of His Word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world." (Pope Francis Aperuit illis 2) Christ Jesus is knocking at our door in the words of sacred scripture. If we hear His voice and open the doors of our minds and hearts, then He will enter our lives and remain ever with us. (Pope Francis Aperuit illis 8). **THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW:** Fr Matt Blake will be presenting a four session course to enable people to deepen their understanding of the context, meaning, significance and message in this book of the scriptures written by St Matthew. In this Year of the Word, we are each encouraged to listen afresh to the Word of God so we can become more open to the God who speaks. The sessions will be running Wednesday evenings at 7:45pm or Thursday mornings at 9:30am January 15/16; 22/23; 29/30 February 5/6. The course is free but donations are welcome. The parish is now providing a **LIVE STREAMING** service. This enables those not able to attend Mass in person to watch and listen to what is happening during Services in St Joseph's Church. All Sunday Masses, Saturday morning 10am Mass and weekday 9am morning Mass are broadcast. The live stream can be accessed via the parish website.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY sessions are held every Sunday during term time at the 9am Mass. There are five different age groups covering pre-schoolers to teens which all children and young people are invited to join in. We go out after the welcome and return after the bidding prayers. Each group covers the gospel of the day in an age appropriate way. The younger groups take part in a mix of activities – colouring, puzzles, songs, etc to bring the story to life, whilst the older groups are helped to think about the real meaning of the reading and how they can relate it to their lives.
