This year we are called to meditate on the words that Jesus addressed to the sinful woman: 'Your sins are forgiven' (Luke 7:48) found within the story in the Gospel of Luke 7:36-50.

St. Joseph's Church will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Friday 20 March from 9.30am - 10am on Saturday 21 March and individual confessions will be offered on Friday from 9.30 - 10.30am, from 2 - 3pm and from 8 - 9pm.
