**COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) UPDATE:** Following official advice and in order to keep each other safe, we will not be gathering for public acts of worship until further notice in any of our churches. This includes all public Masses.

St Joseph's Church will be open each day from 6am until 6:30pm. We encourage you to come along and spend some time in quiet prayer, read the Word of God, light candles, etc.

All our scheduled Masses will be celebrated without a congregation and can be followed on our live stream:

Masses at Denham have been suspended for the foreseeable future.

Confessions will take place at the usual times on Saturday (from 10:30am to 11am and from 4:45pm to 5:15pm) and other times on request. These will only take place in the confessional.

Rosary will go ahead as usual on Tuesdays and Fridays at 7:30pm but will take place in the church so that people can join together in prayer via the live stream.

In all instances, social distancing requirements will be observed. We will do all we can to help and support you spiritually during this time.

### **CARMELITE CONTEMPLATIONS**

We live in difficult and painful times. These words from St. John of the Cross can give us strength and hope [John describes the mysterious work of God in the soul as a "happy night"]: "Even though this happy night darkens the spirit, it does so only to impart light concerning all things; and even though it humbles individuals and reveals their miseries, it does so only to exalt them; and even though it impoverishes and empties them of all possessions and natural affection, it does so only that they may reach out divinely to the enjoyment of all earthly and heavenly things, with a general freedom of spirit in them all".

We cannot see or understand the mysterious work of God in our world today. What we can be certain of is that God walks beside us in these dark and insecure times. His invisible hand is holding and caring for all people. As people of faith our minds must never set limits on what God can do. As the man born blind, whom Jesus meets in today's Gospel, reminds us: "Ever since the world began it is unheard of for anyone to open the eyes of a man who was born blind; if this man were not from God, he couldn't do a thing". Let us pray and trust that God can bring some great good out of the pain and uncertainty that the entire human race is experiencing together at this time in history.
