

This Sunday, Blessed Carlo Acutis will be the first Millennial Saint to be canonised. Born in London and raised in Milan, he was just 15 when he died. But in his short life he was renowned for his charity work and his constant pursuit of holiness. The Word of God and the Holy Eucharist were the centre of his life. His legacy lives on, and he is a worldwide source of inspiration to many, especially young people. We pray that his canonisation will inspire our young people to embrace holiness, a compassion for the poor and a life of generosity and service to God and neighbour.

A NATIONAL EMERGENCY ALERT TEST will take place this Sunday 7 September at 3pm. The Emergency Alerts system warns the public of nearby dangers to life, including extreme weather. Since the first national test in April 2023, five alerts have been issued, including during major storms when lives were at risk.
