#### IN NOVEMEMBER WE REMEMBER

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. It is a time to remember and pray for our loved ones who have gone before us and whose loss we feel.

HOLY SOULS: During November we pray especially for all the Holy Souls: those who have died in the past year, past members of our parish, our own departed relatives and friends and those who have no one to pray for them. As in recent years, we will have the golden Holy Souls box on the altar throughout November. Parishioners are invited to place names of loved ones in the golden box so we can remember them in our prayers.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION continues this week on Monday evening from 6:30pm to 7pm in St Joseph's Church and on Thursday morning after the 9am Mass until 10am in the Oratory.

EMMAUS – OPENING THE SCRIPTURES: Our next talk takes place on Wednesday 3 December in St Joseph's Church. The topic is 'Creation and Evolution: In Conflict or Synergy?' (Genesis 1 & 2) and the speaker is Dr Levi Maria Fernandez. Are the theories of the Big Bang and of Evolution compatible with the story of Creation in Genesis? Is Science at odds with Christianity? This talk will also explore the history of science through the Dark Ages and the Age of Enlightenment.

I have been a Biology teacher for 30 years, the last 13 of which have been at Wycombe Abbey, and independent boarding school for girls. I studied Biology at King's College London and completed a PhD in Molecular Biology at what was then called Queen Mary and Westfield College of the University of London. I was born in the Philippines and studied in the Philippine Science High School, in an environment where the love of science and of faith in God comfortably went hand in hand.
