HOMELESS SUNDAY: Homelessness has always been one of our parish's main outreach programmes, because we believe that everyone has a right to a roof over their head. For this reason, at this time of the year, our parish reaches out to our homeless charities. Next Sunday 18 January there will be an appeal and second collection at all Masses for the [London & Slough Charitable Trust](#). It operates a weekly 'run' on a Monday evening to Temple and Waterloo in London, delivering soup, hot drinks, food, clothing and toiletries to those living on the streets. It also runs a food hub in Slough (soon to be Langley), collecting surplus food from local supermarkets and redistributing items to people and families in need as well as various organisations who serve the local community.

THE LONDON & SLOUGH RUN continues on Mondays throughout January. Please bring your sandwiches, boiled eggs, soft fruit, crisps, drinks, individually wrapped cakes and small chocolate biscuit bars to the First Committee Room by 12 noon.

NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS

Inspired by Pope Francis

- 1. Reject Gossip** – Gossip wounds charity and destroys communion. Speaking ill of others, even casually, betrays the dignity of the person and harms the Body of Christ. A disciple of Jesus chooses words that heal, not words that tear down.
- 2. Respect Food and Avoid Waste** – To waste food is to forget the poor. Gratitude for every meal teaches us solidarity and reminds us of our responsibility to share God's gifts with those in need.
- 3. Give Time to Others** – Holiness is lived in small acts of love. Making time to listen, to thank, and to affirm others reflects the kindness of Christ and builds a culture of encounter.
- 4. Live Simply and Humbly** – Material possessions promise happiness but never satisfy the heart. Simplicity frees us from attachment and opens our lives to trust in God, who alone fulfills our deepest desires.
- 5. Encounter the Poor Personally** – Christian charity goes beyond giving – it involves presence. True love seeks to restore dignity and transform lives through genuine encounter and compassion.
- 6. Stop Judging** – Only God sees the heart. Judgment rooted in pride and hatred distorts our vision and poisons our relationships. Mercy, not condemnation, is the mark of a true follower of Christ.
- 7. Engage in Dialogue** – Differences need not divide us. Dialogue, even with those who disagree, fosters understanding and peace in families, communities, and society.
- 8. Be Faithful to Commitments** – Christian maturity calls us to resist the culture of convenience and fleeting pleasure. Faithfulness – to promises, responsibilities, and vocation – is a courageous witness to hope.
- 9. Seek God's Will in Prayer** – Uncertainty about the future is common, especially among the young. Like Samuel, we are invited to listen attentively and trust that God will reveal our path in His time.
- 10. Choose Joy** – Joy is not a passing emotion but a fruit of walking with God. When we live close to Him, joy overflows – and shared joy multiplies.
